Welcome Back to the New Church Year!

Hal Borland says, "If you would know strength and patience, welcome the company of trees." In New England, the trees all around us in our yards and in our forests are living testimonials to the beauty of creation and to the strength that God has put in every living thing. Trees grace our lives with welcome shade and habitats for a beneficial ecological network of forest creatures. We mark the changing seasons by leaf changes: bare bark in winter, budding green in spring and summer, and red/golden/brown we now look forward to before the next month is out. Each change in our trees is a "welcome back" message to a new but familiar season. Within the welcoming, familiar rhythms of life we find strength and patience to explore and endure all that earthly life holds in store for us.

Samson reveals the secret of this strength Delilah in Judges 16:17: "A razor has never come upon my head; for I have been a Nazarite to God from my mother's womb. If my head were shaved, then my strength would leave me; I would become weak, and be like anyone else." Samson was wise to know the source of his strength, to stand firm, honor and sustain it. The wisdom of Proverbs 10:29 teaches us, "The way of the Lord is a stronghold for the upright."

Like trees, our church graces our lives with welcome refuge in all circumstances of life and is a habitat for a beneficial spiritual network of souls. We mark the changing seasons by changes in our liturgy and church activities: Ordinary Time, Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter and Pentecost. Like seasons of trees, seasons of church life each offer its familiar but renewed "welcome back" message to us. Within the welcoming rhythms of weekly worship and church seasons, we find strength and patience to grow and endure in the company of other sojourners, all that life holds in store for us, according to God's plan.

Like Samson, we must grow in our knowledge and wise guarding of the true source of our strength. Like Samson, we must admit that, when we wander very far from the source of that strength, we become weaker, we are tempted to become like "anyone else" who relies on trendy gurus and material things whose strength fades before the season fades.

Welcome back to the new church year! May we all resolve to spend this year growing closer in spirit to each other in church and to the Lord, our true and ever-faithful stronghold. I look forward to walking alongside each of you as this year unfolds!

Unlike the financial straits last summer, we have been able to keep our bills paid on time this summer, and we are on target with our commitment to Conference...something that fewer and fewer churches can say!

Did you know we get paid 5 cents a pound for our collect of books, DVDs, and CDs that we collect?
Did you know that the Trustees give this money to the general fund toward monthly bills?
Did you know that we (on average) have the bin emptied every month because it is full?
Thanks to everyone that continues to help fill the bin every month. Not only is this a great fund raiser, it also helps us keep these items out of our land fills.

Amazing Progress by the Trustees!

Check out the building projects completed this summer by only FOUR hard-working TRUSTEES!

- Safer concrete steps being installed at doors leading outside from the Vestry
- The rear corner roof of the Sanctuary has been patched
- Railings installed on cellar stairway
- Trim on 13 outside windows scraped and repainted
- New switches installed in the sanctuary
- New gutters installed on kitchen-side of roof
- Front sidewalk replaced (thanks to Beals Construction for donation of labor)
- Choir room repainted. Soon to be redecorated with furniture and rugs so that we will have a Parlor

All this work was required by our property and liability insurance company who sent in inspector out last spring. There is still more work that must be done before the snow flies: the front half of the education wing must be re-roofed. We are lucky that it has survived the rainy summer. It will not last over the winter, and the insurance company will not pay a claim if we have water damage due to deferred maintenance. We need \$11,000 immediately to complete the roofing needed in the next 60 days. Please prayerfully consider giving a special offering now:

Don't Forget to Bring Food Offerings the First Sunday of Each Month.

We always have a suggestion for items urgently needed at the Food Bank, but the truth is that any non-perishable food items that are still within the expiration dates are needed! Every time you go to the store, please pick up one extra item and bring it to the Food Pantry box in the Vestry. Each First Sunday, in keeping with the tradition of almsgiving at Communion, a tradition that we can trace back even to the earliest Christian years, we bless our offerings on the altar and then send them to the Food Bank. Our local Food Pantry serves 600+ families each month. September and October are historically the lowest donation months of the year. It's a shame when the Pantry has to close because it is empty. The overwhelming majority of hungry families in Marlborough are working poor, single mothers, handicapped individuals, and elderly. Ever month, these households must choose between purchasing food or medicine or utilities. We worship a God who put plenty of resources in the world. It's up to us to make sure that those resources are adequately distributed in our town. Here is a list of SUGGESTED ITEMS; IF YOU DON'T LIKE THESE, BRING SOMETHING ELSE! POST THIS LIST ON YOUR REFRIGERATOR OR NEAR YOUR GROCERY LIST:

First Sunday in October: cold cereals

First Sunday in November: black beans, kidney beans, baked beans

First Sunday in December: jars of baby food, especially fruit, baby cereal

First Sunday in January: hot cereals

First Sunday in February: spaghetti sauce in cans or jars

First Sunday in March: baby formula (Enfamil, Similac, etc.)

First Sunday in April: jelly or jam

First Sunday in May: canned tuna, especially white tuna

First Sunday in June: crackers (all varieties), cookies, raisins, granola bars, popcorn

First Sunday in July: diapers (size 3,4 or 5 are most needed)

First Sunday in August: shampoo, cr me rinse, soap, toothpaste, deodorant

First Sunday in September: paper goods: toilet paper, paper towels, Kleenex
